ALL CRAFT TO KEEP TO THE 6MPH AND 10 MPH SPEED LIMIT

There is a Lake Patrol Team made up of South Lakeland District Council Wardens and National Park Authority Rangers. The team carries out lake patrols, enforces the lake byelaws and can prosecute offenders. They also manage boat launches, rent lake moorings and the registration scheme.
